

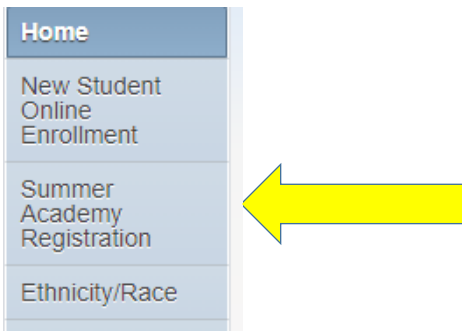

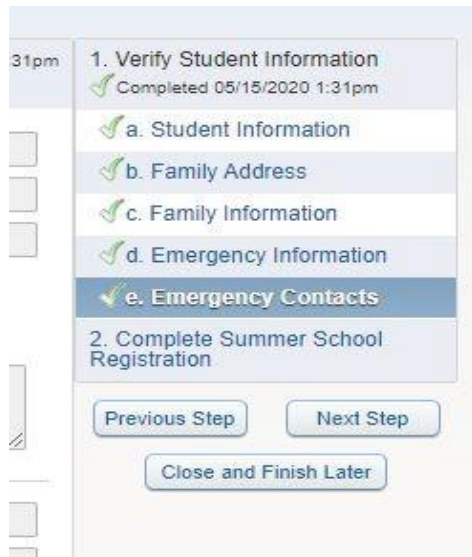
### Step 1: Log into Skyward Family Access



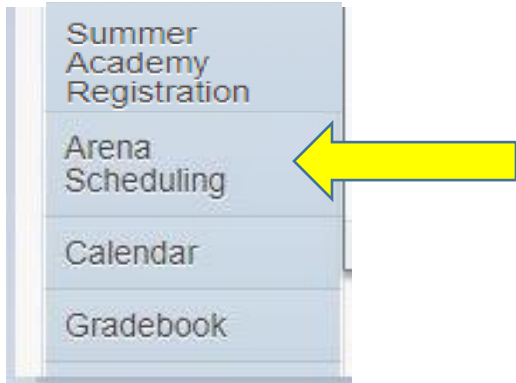
### Step 2: Once you are logged in, click on Summer Academy registration tab.



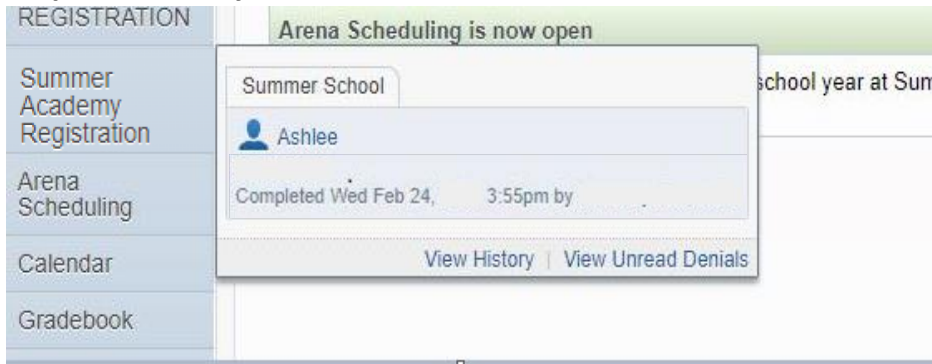
**Step 3: Complete the registration process by verifying each step 1a – 1e. Each step should have a green check to show that it was completed. Click on Complete Summer School Registration.**
